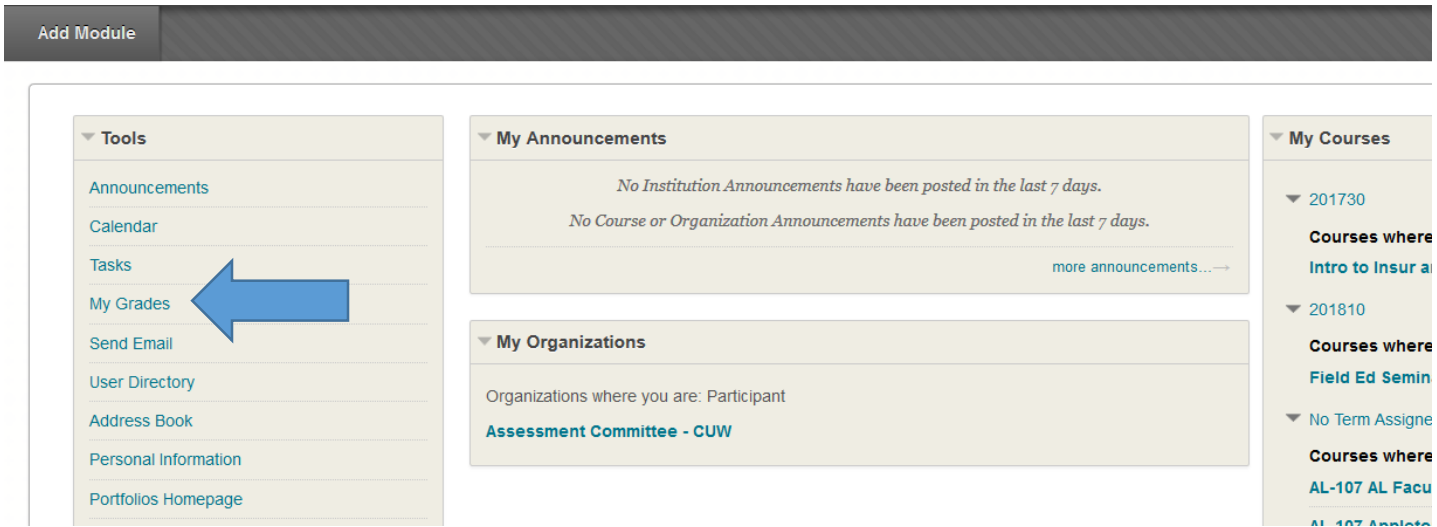


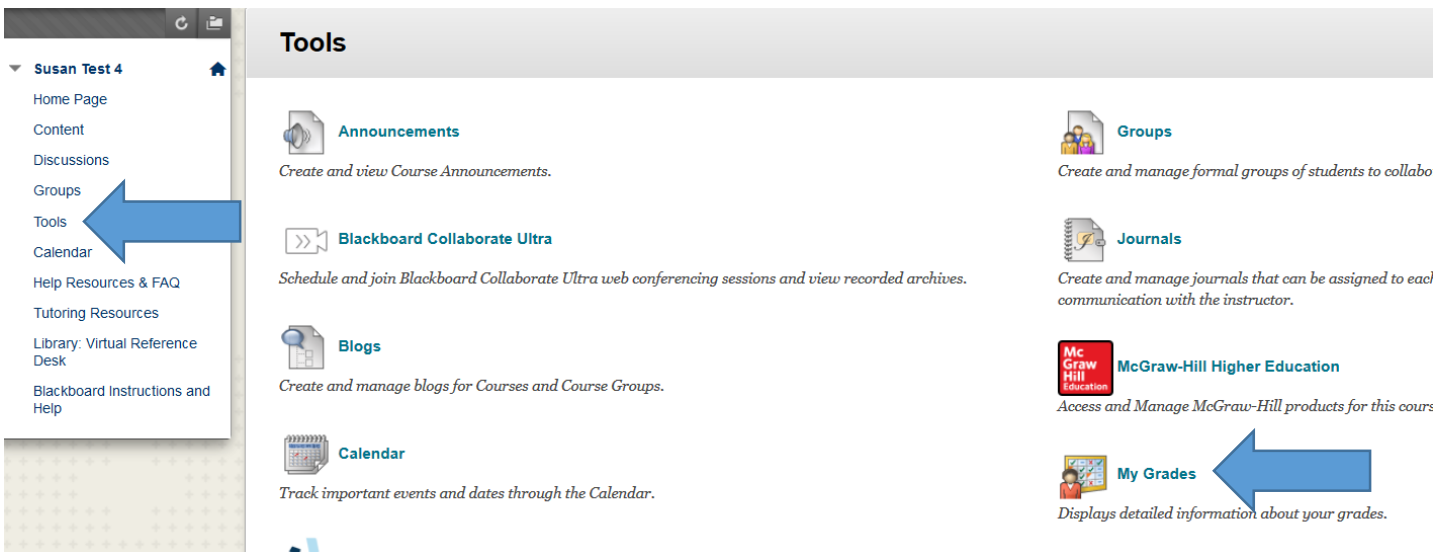
# Find Graded Assignments, Instructor Feedback, and SafeAssign Report
