


Discussion Boards: View, Subscribe, Read and Respond


1. Discussion Boards: View, subscribe, read, and respond

a. To view a discussion forum, click on Content, then click on the session folder that you want to view.

Within your post complete these two statements: 1) 'What I want from my education is ...' and 2) 'When I complete my education I want to be able to ...' When you respond to two of your classmates' posts, note the similarities as well as the differences between your responses.'

c. Click on the Subscribe button to receive email notifications when others post to this forum.
