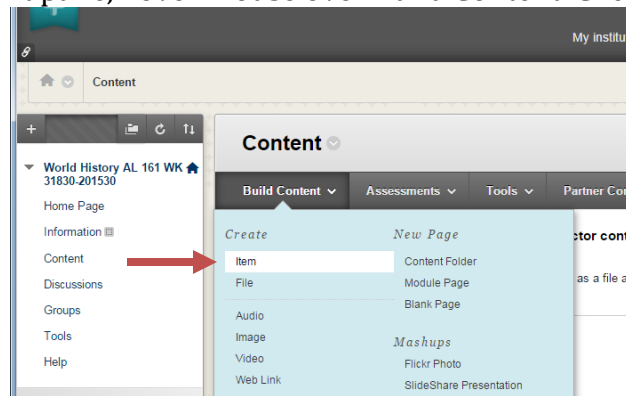


Embed a YouTube Video Using the Embed Code

1. From the Content pane, hover mouse over Build Content. Click on Item.



2. Enter Name and (optional) description.

- Click on the HTML button. Another box will pop up. At the end of the text in that box (p>) paste the embed code (control + V). Click Update.

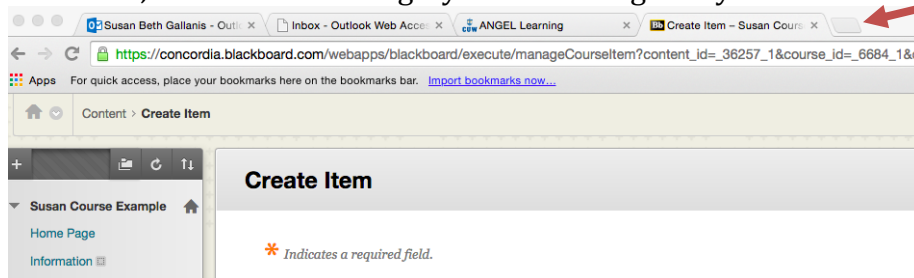

5. The YouTube video is embedded into your course.

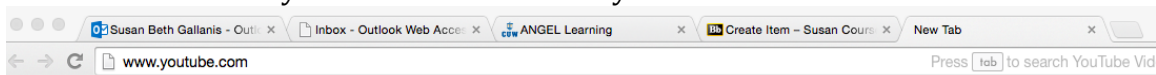


6. Locate the YouTube video embed code.

- a. Open a separate browser window. The procedure will be slightly different depending on the Internet browser you are using. For example, using Google Chrome, click on the small grey box to the right of your current window.



- b. A new window (or tab) opens. You can then type www.YouTube.com to find the video you want to embed into your course.



- c. When you have the video you want to embed, click on Share, then click on Embed. Copy the link provided (control + C). Return to step 3 to paste the embed code into your course.
