## Panopto News



**Panopto recently updated:** If you use the Panopto tool in your Blackboard course, you might have noticed the tool is no longer available. This is due to some recent Panopto updates. Click [this link](#) for a video that explains how to fix the issue.

**Panopto recordings to be archived:** Due to the high utilization of Panopto, academic recordings will need to be archived after three semesters. Folders that are four semesters or older will be deleted from the Panopto server after each semester. For example, a folder with term code 201410 (Fall 2013) will be removed from Panopto at the start of the 201610 (Fall 2015) term. There are many folders that are unlabeled, these will be removed as well if they are more than four semesters old.

If your current classes require videos from older terms it will be the responsibility of the folder owner to move the recordings from those folders slated for deletion. [Click here](#) for instructions to move Panopto videos to a current folder (in Panopto).
